Shell Terminal: Meeting to discuss the impact of the closure of the Clyde Refinery on Gore Bay, was attended by Greenwich Community Association committee members, who reported back to the Greenwich Community Association meeting.

Questions were raised as to the potential impact of some changes, with increased shipping movement, on the local community.

There will be no blending of product at Gore Bay.

Some storage tanks will be removed.

Fewer employees will be retained at Gore Bay.

Amendment to the notice in the newsletter – Gore Bay will be used as a storage facility before pumping through to Clyde Refinery.

Ms Xiao expressed interest in attending future Shell community meetings

2 Greenwich Shopping Precinct Upgrade: Waiting for signage from Lane Cove Council as to when work will commence.

Lighting cables to be laid before rest of work can be started.

Bus stop sign in Wardrop Street has been changed to reflect new parking times.

Peter Walton and John May have developed a comprehensive and very detailed proposal for Wardrop Street that will create an additional 13 parking spots.

Peter Walton to provide Dion Weston with the parking proposal and for it to be taken to Lane Cove Council for their consideration. Then for it to be raised at the next Greenwich Community Association meeting.

3 Greenwich Baths: Fran and Tim Fowler have finished their management of the Baths and are moving to Central Coast. Greenwich Community Association expressed appreciation for their excellent work at the Baths.

BlueFit will continue to operate the Baths and will provide new management, this is still to be finalised.

Question raised by Dion Weston as to the feasibility of providing a coffee facility for people outside of the Baths.
