### THE SHOPPING PRECINCT UPGRADE IS ABOUT TO START

Towards the end of 2010 the community worked closely with Council on a plan to enhance our Greenwich shopping precinct. The project is to be delivered in two stages and it is understood that the first sod is about to be turned! The initial step will be the installation of cabling under the footpath for the lighting of the pedestrian crossing. This will be followed by the main work in early to mid June, with an estimated completion time of four weeks. Information signage will be erected near the shops to update the community on the project.

And we have some good news. The final pricing for Stage 1 has come in below budget, allowing for additional paving. And signage at the Wardrop Street bus stop has been altered to free up more parking spaces when the bus stop is not required for school purposes.

### PROPOSED CHANGES AT SHELL'S GORE BAY TERMINAL

It is proposed that Shell's facility at Clyde will cease to operate as a refinery from 2013 as it is no longer regionally competitive. The facility will operate, instead, as a refined product terminal. The Gore Bay Terminal will, therefore, cease to be used for the importation of crude oil and will handle only refined product. As is the case now, the bulk of the product handled at Gore Bay will be pumped to Clyde as it is discharged from vessels.

At a recent community information session Shell assured residents that there would be no trucking from Gore Bay, most of the tanks would be retained for buffer purposes, there would be no product blending done at Gore Bay and the facility would have fewer employees. Assurances were given that world best safety standards would be upheld and that the facility had operated in this mode to date.
