At the pharmacy, building works are not yet complete. The new first floor will accommodate two commercial or professional suites.

While a thriving shopping centre provides us with a great local community service, it has meant that

parking close by has become more difficult. Also, increased parking restrictions around Wollstonecraft station have pushed more commuter parking onto Greenwich Rd.

We will be working closely with Council to look at ways to improve the situation.

COUNCIL RATES TO RISE BY 6%

While rates have been pegged by the State Government for many years now, we all expect local Councils to provide more and more services. As a way of meeting this need and raising the extra funds required, some Councils have applied for the right to introduce an "infrastructure levy" or an "environmental levy". Lane Cove Council has just voted to do likewise, introducing a "sustainability levy".

The levy will mean an extra 6% charge will appear each year on your rates notice. The revenue will be targeted at projects which improve our environment, the local economy and Council services in a sustainable way.
